Bear Accessories

Materials List

- *Wool Felt
- *Thread to match
- *Thread in contrasting color
- *4mm elastic
- Optional: double stick tape

Tools

- *Scissors
- *Sewing needle

I taped my my pattern in place for cutting using double sided tape.

And I burned the ends of my length of elastic to prevent fraying.



Ears

Overlap ends of elastic and stitch together.



Take the ovals for the ears and fold in half over the elastic. Stitch around the edge without catching the elastic in your stitching so that the ears can be adjusted later.

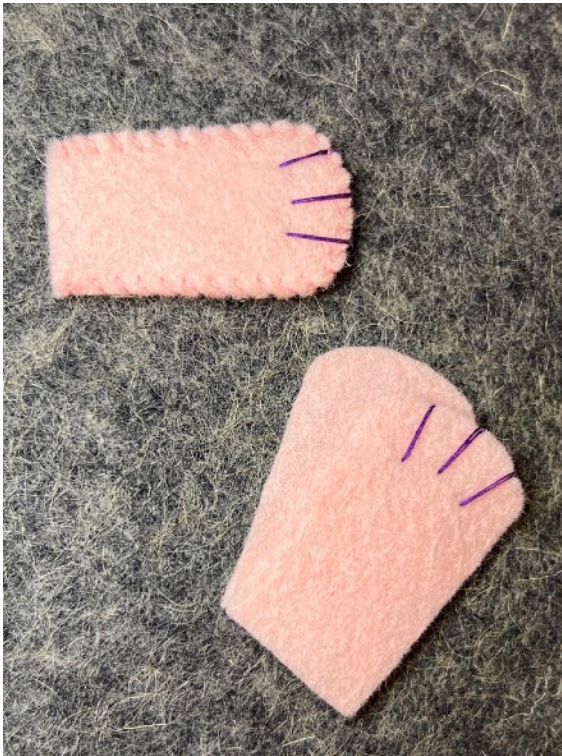


Pin



Mitts

Cut out pieces and embroider paw marks on two of the pieces, if desired. I used a whip stitch and knotted it on the inside.



Stitch around the outside curved edge, leaving the narrow straight edge open for placing on hand.

These can make great hot pad mitts in the kitchen, as well, if your Sindy likes to cook.

Slippers

Cut out the slipper pieces and if you got here from my video you might notice there's another piece called the heel mustache, it's optional.

The sole can be doubled and you can add a piece of cardboard for stiffness, if you like.

Embroider the paw marks on the round edge of the vamp. These slippers do not have a right and left but you can shift your paw marks to be mirror image if you'd like.



Whip stitched and knotted on the inside.



Center the vamp on the sole and match A to B on both sides and stitch around. I used a whip stitch



You can stop here, use pompoms or a design of your own for slippers.



Center the heel mustache, matching C to D on both sides and stitch around.



Tack the heel mustache to the vamp with a triple stitch anchor on both sides to help keep the slipper on.





Use these with my catsuit pattern, space jumpsuit or t-shirt and leggings of your own for a cute bear costume or pyjamas.

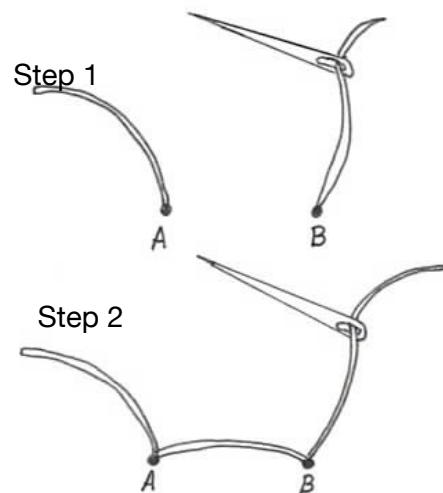


Triple Stitch Anchor

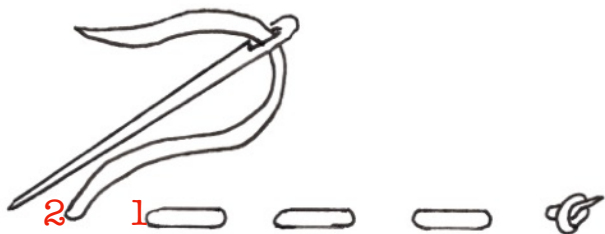
Insert your needle at A and come out at B, leave a tail at A.

Insert your needle at A again and come out at B

Repeat A to B to A a total of three times.

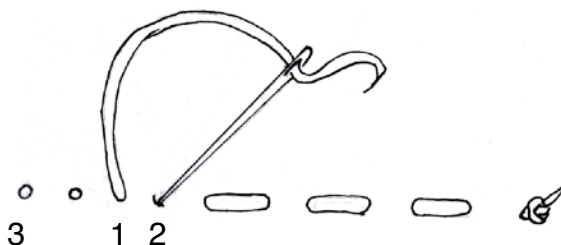


Stitch Guides



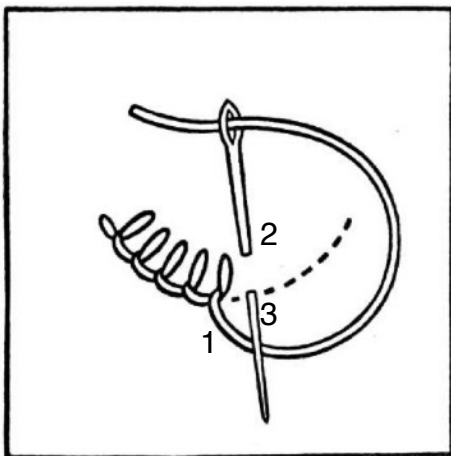
Running Stitch

Insert your needle down at 1 and come back out at 2.
2 becomes 1 and you repeat.



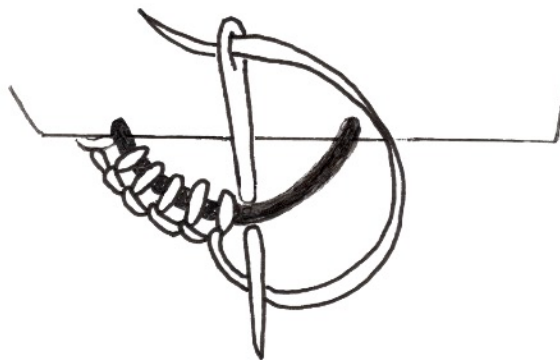
Back Stitch:

*Bring your needle up at 1
*Insert your needle down at 2, bringing the tip back up at 3.
*3 becomes 1 and repeat.

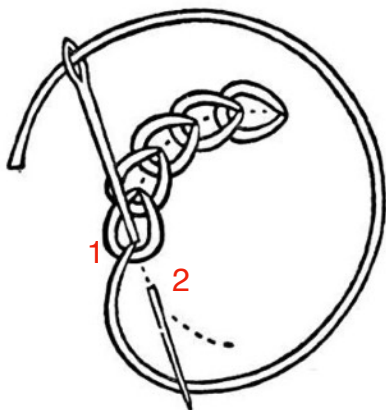


Blanket Stitch:

*Anchor your thread on the back coming out at 1
*Insert your needle down at 2 coming out at 3, with the working thread behind your needle.
*3 becomes 1, and repeat



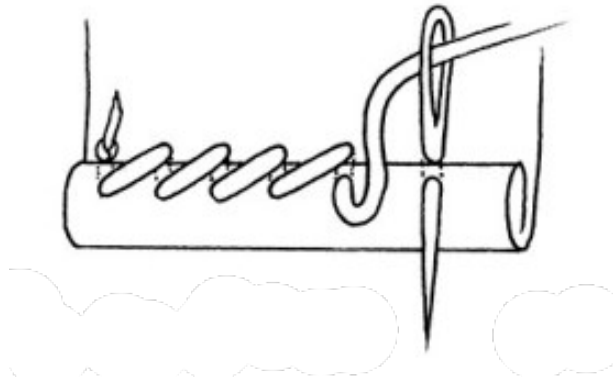
Button Loop: Create a loop at the edge of your dress opening that will fit over your button. Stitch over the loop, covering it using the blanket stitch.



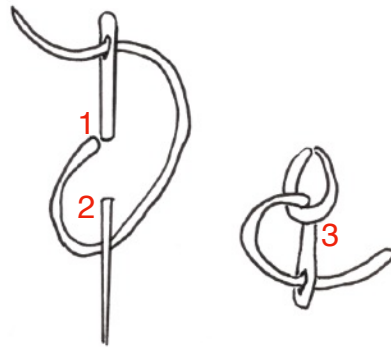
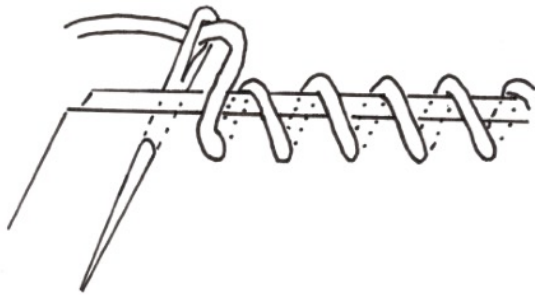
Chain Stitch:

*Bring the needle up at 1.
*Insert the needle again at 1, and bring the needle tip up at 2, with the working thread behind the needle, and pull the needle through the loop.
* Repeat, anchoring with a small stitch at the end.

Lazy Daisy:

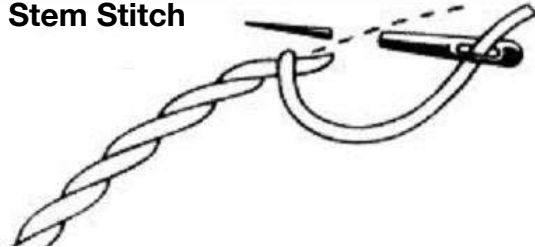
*Bring the needle up at 1.

*Insert the needle again at 1, and bring the needle tip up at 2, with the working thread behind the needle, and pull the needle through the loop.

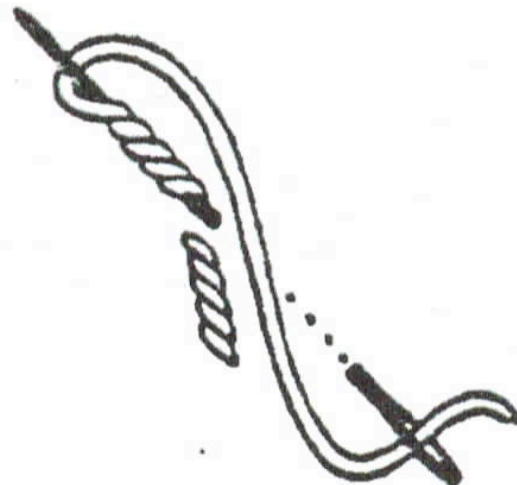
* Anchoring with a small stitch at 3.

* Repeat for chosen design

French Knot



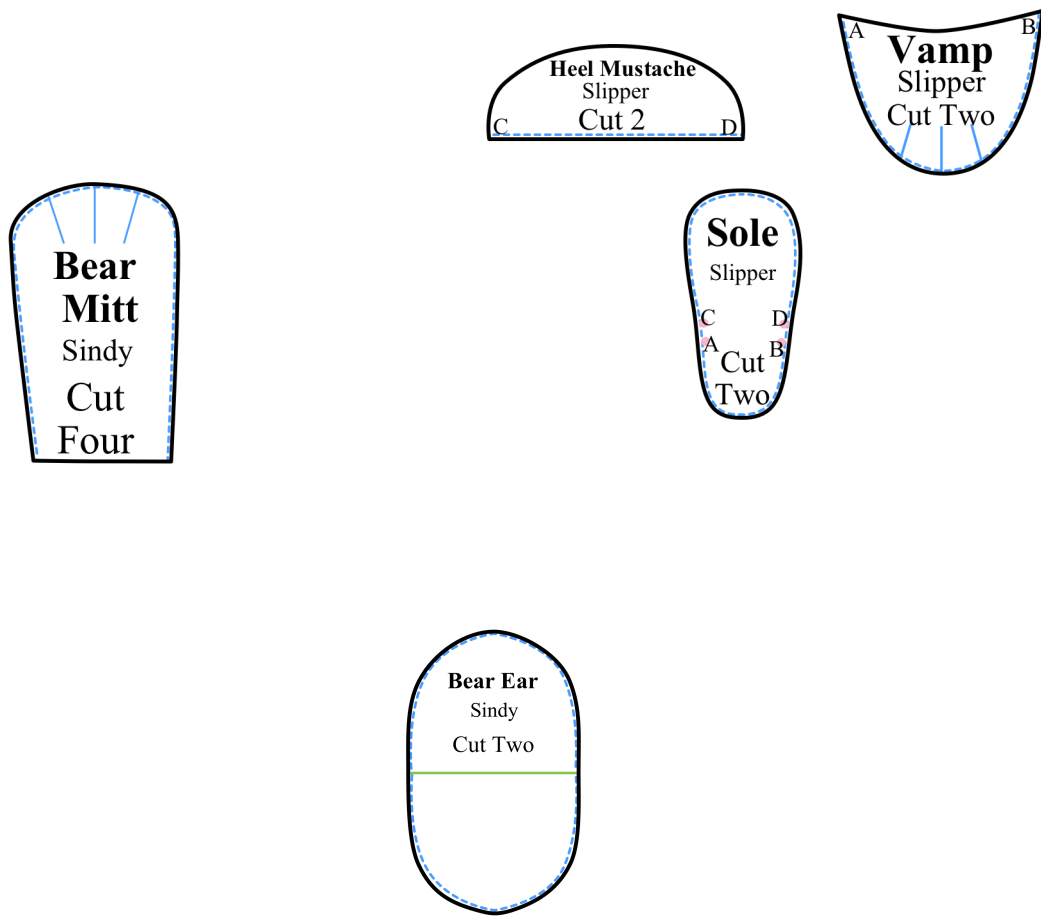
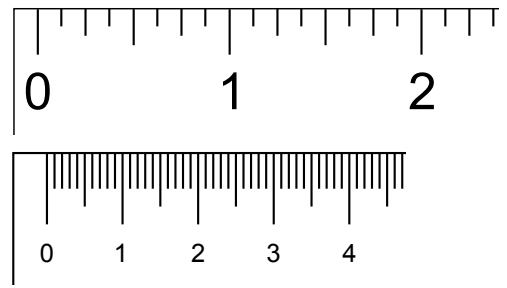
Bullion Stitch
